HISTORY

Rural Development Network in Bosnia and Herzegovina (RDN in BiH) was established in Sarajevo, 2014.

RDN BiH have 14 member organizations. Membership structure consists of 13 civil society organisations and 1 Local action group (LAGs). RDN BiH operates on the overall territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

RDN BiH is established with a goal to achieve a strong and strategic partnership of civil society sector which operates in the field of rural development in BiH.

Rural Development Network in BiH intends to become a serious partner to public sector and contribute to the creation and shaping of public policies.

OBJECTIVES

- To improve cooperation, dialogue and overall activity of civil society organisations and public bodies that operate in rural development sector, with the aim of representing the interests of rural population and enable exchange of information, knowledge, experiences and views of various stakeholders from rural areas.
- To contribute to the improvement of quality of life in rural areas of Bosnia and Herzegovina by promoting sustainable usage of existing resources to stimulate development of rural areas and improve rural economy.
- To represent the interests of RDN in BiH members

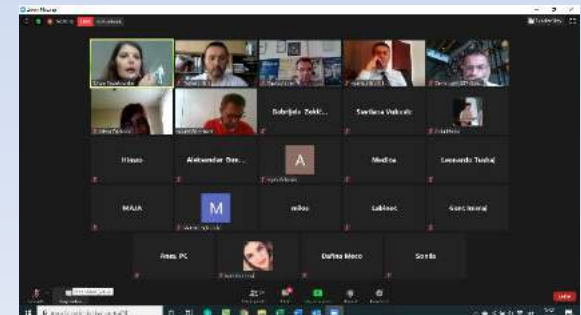
ACTIVITIES – NEW DIMENSIONS- Development Policy Foundation, Poland

ACTIVITIES – GREEN WORKS PROJECT - *CRP Tuzla and CERD Laktasi*



Jan 1, 2021. – October 31, 2023

Overall objective: To enhance the impact of the civil society in the field of environmental protection and climate change by capacity building, networking and public campaign of local CSOs network

1. Promotion of clean air and soil solutions;
2. Improved capacity of at least 45 local CSOs for *green solutions* in soil and air protection, participation in decision making, advocacy and lobbying and monitoring of public policies, familiarised with the good EU practice and available mechanisms and actions of civil sector in this area;
3. Study on air pollution impact of residential households coal heating in Tuzla Canton area and agricultural production negative impact on soil pollution in Lijevo polje, wider Banja Luka region
4. Developed concept for introducing green financing mechanism with public sector institutions to reduce pollutions in air and soil;
5. “GreenWorks” promoted in BiH through the activities of the network, and increased public awareness on negative impact of fossil fuels and agricultural production to environmental pressures – air and soil pollution
6. Improved collaboration of “GreenWorks” CSOs with local cantonal, entities and national authorities in open and constructive institutional dialogue
